Indian Institute of Information Technology Allahabad (IIITA), Prayagraj

This Ordinance shall govern the award of **Degree(s)/Diploma(s)/Certificate(s)by IIITA**, **Prayagraj under a Flexible Academic Program** (**FAP**) offered by IIITA Prayagraj along with the consortium of (Indian as well as Foreign) Institutes/universities created for the purpose. As per the spirit of New Education Policy (NEP) 2020,this ordinance for FAP has following two sections:

Section A:Pertains to the Generality, Scope and Features of the flexible academic program. (Referred to as GSF-FAP)

Section B:Pertains to Admissions, Program Layout and Assessment under FAP. (Referred to as APA-FAP)

(Note - Both Sections contain few definitions in the beginning, which have been used inboth the sections to imply similarly, until and unless specifically stated otherwise)

Flexible Academic Program Ordinance (FAP) 2021 Section A(Generality, Scope and Features of FAP)

IIITA shall constitute a (non-profit) section 8 company for implementingthe FAP w.ef. academic session 2021 and afterwards. This company shall also create a consortium of various Indian and Foreign Institutes/Universities for taking part and strengthening this initiative of IIITA. To begin with, the participating institutes/universities are expected to encourage its faculty members to offer some of the courses from the baskets titled as Information Technology (IT), Electronics and Communications (ECE), and Business Administration (BA), Mathematics (MATH). Physics (PHY), and Miscellaneous multidisciplinary (The initial baskets are placed at Annexure-A , more courses may be added by the Chairman FAP as per the need of the program). These courses may be offered in the traditional Oncampus mode or the ONLINE mode or both. Fee and number of students who can opt a particular sources must be mentioned for each such course along with its mode of operation. (It may be different for different courses and/or same course offered by different institutes or different faculty of same institute. For each student enrolled in these courses, some percentage will go to faculty as honorarium, its parent institute, towards operation and maintenance expenses etc.) Initially, some restriction may be placed on students to choose subjects from different baskets and the lab modules in order to ensure that the person who may opts 'early exit' option must have learned some skills. IIITA wills and acts as the nodal center and issues all carditates who erroll under this flexible program. The IIITA's section 8 company may create a'Coordination Committee' consisting of the members from all participating institutes for coordinating all activities related to this




